
#### Christ is Risen!

He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!

I love worship, and I especially love worship on our "big" worship days: Easter, Christmas Eve, Pentecost, World Communion Sunday, Ash Wednesday and more. I was energized and filled spiritually on Easter Sunday a few weeks ago. It was so much fun to see that the alleluias first placed in a small wooden chest at the beginning of Lent had multiplied, and then were scattered around the sanctuary and church building. To hear the joy of God and of friendship; of alleluias in word and song, smile and handshakes. Easter is wonderful, and it does not stop on Easter Sunday. This time between Easter Sunday and Pentecost is known as Eastertide. Much like Christmas is not one day, but 12. Easter is not just one Sunday, but a whole season. Known as Eastertide it consists of 50 days and ends on Pentecost Sunday. And every Sunday of the church year, even in Lent, are mini-Easters. Even though Easter is a season, we pray that it is a reality. The quote: "We are an Easter people, living in a Good Friday World" was first attributed to Barbara Johnson, though is often used by Anne Lamott, and many pastors I know as well. There is death, heartache, grief, and hurt seemingly everywhere we look in the world. But Easter says, all that does not get the last word. I hope that Easter becomes not just a season, but a reality of the good news that breaks into and disperses the Good Friday nature of our world, by living as a people who celebrate and show the love of God. My prayer for you, is that well beyond this Easter, you continue to live as an Easter people this day and every day, transforming the world into the kin-dom of God.

And all God's children say: Alleluia, Amen!

Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church. The Holy Spirit remains with us still, connecting us with the church of the past, continuing to inspire the church of today, and pointing us to the church of the future. Each year, this celebration is marked by receiving the Pentecost Offering which nurtures the faith of those who are the church that is to come.

Since the Pentecost Offering started in 1998, Presbyterians have raised nearly \$18 million for ministries that benefit younger members of God's family.

Your gifts at work:

- 40% of the Offering stays with the local church to support ministries with children and youth in the church and community. Churches have used funds to assist the families of children at risk, support education for at-risk youth, and grow mission work with youth and young adults
- 25% of the Offering goes to the Young Adult Volunteer (YAV) experience. Offerings help to train and equip volunteers to engage in mission in 8 sites in the US and around the world.
- 25% of the Offering supports ministries with youth, ages 12-18 and those called to work with them to support the Presbyterian Youth Triennium, and support resources for Youth Ministry.
- 10% of the Offering supports "Educate a Child, Transform the World" a national initiative to motivate and inspire Presbyterians to better the lives of children by advocating for equitable, accessible, quality public education.

The Pentecost Offering will be received on Pentecost, June 8, 2025.

Tuesday, April 15, 2025


